**January 2000:** Former Liverpool Police Officers – **Detective Senior Constable Mark McDonald, Senior Constable Kerrie-Lyn Reko and Senior Constable Malcolm Pascoe** were awarded the Camden Local Area Commander's Citations for bravery in January, 1999 in arresting an armed offender who had just committed a robbery at a bank in Bowral, where shots were fired.

**22 February 1979:** Liverpool Police Officers – **Constables Malcolm. T. Pascoe and Charles. R. Turton**, were both " *Commended for courage and devotion to duty at Heckenberg when on the 13<sup>th</sup> March 1978 when in company with **Constable C. R. Turton**, he challenged a suspect who produced a knife and threatened both Police. **Constable Turton** drew his Service revolver and attempted to talk to the man until **Constable Pascoe** was able to seize the offender who was then overpowered, disarmed and arrested "* by the two Constables. Signed by **Mervyn. T. Wood** Commissioner of Police.

**13 March 1978:** Constables Malcolm T. Pascoe and Charles R. Turton, were patrolling Heckenberg, when they challenged a male person, who then produced a knife and threatened the two Constables.

Constable Turton drew his service revolver and tried to talk to the man until Constable Pascoe was able to seize the offender, who was then overpowered, disarmed and arrested by the two Constables.

### **Service Card Information:**

Prior to joining the NSWPF – Malcolm was a Car salesman for 22 months and worked at the Frank Brooking Volvo & VW dealership, Camden, NSW.

He was 183.5cm tall and 93kg. He had Blue eyes, Fair hair and a Fair complexion and was born in Sydney.

He was Single but married on the 10 June 1978.

He passed his Constable 1/c exam on the 29 August 1978 and also successfully completed the Industrial Supervision Certificate Course.

During the 1980s, the Police Service Cards were being

computerised and, thus, no further details are recorded on his old Card since April 1981.
