In 1959, Steve was born to a farming family, in Tullamore, a small town in the Central West of NSW. At 11 years old, Steve was sent to live in a full time boarding home and attend Forbes High School. At 4th Form (Year 10), Steve left school at 16 years old, and completed the trade of Mechanic.

Mid 1980's Steve got a lift to Griffith NSW, in a friend's truck, where he lived for about 10 years. He worked at Keith Gill Ford for several years, as a car salesman, before applying for his dream career of NSW Police Officer and following the footsteps of his grandfather Eric George Bailey.

Steve was very proud of his grandfather, who tragically became the first policeman in Australia to arrest his own murderer, and be awarded the posthumous Australia recipient George Cross Medal in 1945.



Steve loved the game of Rugby League, and in Griffith played for both Yenda & Griffith Black & Whites Football teams in the Second Row. Steve also won the title of most goals kicked within a country football comp in one year, to which he featured in a Country Rugby League magazine.

In 1988, Steve 28 yrs old, met Lorena 20 yrs old, and with Griffith being a wonderful close knit community, they both enjoyed social outings with many friends.

In September 1989, Steve & Lorena married. They left Griffith in 1994, and moved to Wagga. Following Lorena's Nursing Graduation, they then moved to the Northern Rivers, and built their dream hobby farm and coastal life.

Steve enjoyed his time stationed at Lismore, Ballina & Byron Bay.

The apple of Steve's eye was born, June 2006, Sonny Stephen Robert. Steve took five months long service leave to help raise his beautiful son. When Sonny turned 5 years old, the family travelled the world for the most part of nine years.

South east Asia, the USA, Europe and Scandinavia become our second homes, making many beautiful life long friends along the way. The world's knowledge and experience was very enriching, for the three of us as a family and especially for Sonny's education.



One day, Steve in Italian language, loudly, burst into song, "Oh Sole Mio" and serenaded cousin Fulvia from the ancient cobbled stone footpath. Fulvia was above hanging out of a second story window, and she shouted down a few choice Italian words to the street below, enjoying their bantering.



This year, Steve experienced one of his proudest moments as a dad to Sonny, when Sonny became School Captain and was featured on the school billboard, which Steve told all his friends to drive past and see.

Steve was a strong, fit man who enjoyed walking and riding his bicycle, catching up with his friends twice a week for coffee, and happily joking with everyone he met.

Life can be unfair. Steve's life was cut too short, leaving us questioning why?

Knowing Steve for 35 years, I can say he lived a full, well and happy life, and now may Steve gently Rest In Peace, whilst he watches Sonny's future life achievements from above.
