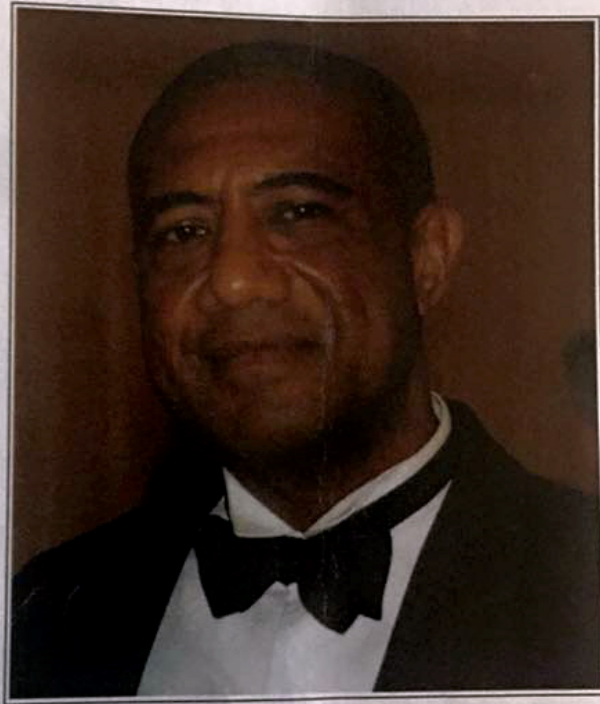

Police radio room is a bundle of nerves

The radio operations room of the NSW Police is the central nervous system of the force — a central nervous system which is slightly twitchy.

The radio operations room works 24 hours a day, every day of the year. The people who work in it, in an old building in Surrey Hills, live among Sydney's disasters. They are a phone call away from being the centre of a rescue, an accident, a life and death situation at any time.

A NSW Government report into the health of members of the communications section of the police force found that many were suffering problems, mainly brought on by stress.

The report found that its members were working far too much overtime — up to a week extra each month — because the section was undermanned.

The number of emergency calls to the section increased by 57 per cent between 1983 and 1985. But in that time there has been no increase in staff. The section has applied for an increase of 66 people.

Because of the workload, it is difficult at the moment to take people off regular duty to train them on new equipment about to be installed.

The communications section includes the police switchboard, which receives transferred 000

emergency calls and must decide whether to divert them to the radio room for an immediate response, or to a local police station.

The radio operations room is staffed by up to eight telephonists who take the distraught messages of people reporting murders, family tragedies or horrific accidents.

As well as the stress of passing on quick, accurate messages, the operators also have to experience the frustration of sometimes not having a car available, or the anxiety of directing police to an armed hold-up.

Inspector Leon Bowra, who works in the section, said calling a high-speed pursuit was like calling a horse race, except that it was more important to be accurate.

As well, there were the more mundane things such as checking vehicle registration numbers, driver's licences, or warrants against people, using a computer installed on their desks.

Unlike other jobs, they can not wander off to the toilet when they like.

It is hoped that when the section is transferred to the new police centre working conditions will improve.

At the moment some of the equipment is old, and workers try to get some fresh air through an open window at the end of a large room.

She was the wife of a 'giant' in the New South Wales Police Rescue Squad, Sergeant William (Bill, Uncle Bill) Fahey. Liz and Bill were living in Queensland when Bill died some years back. Liz moved back to NSW but not much is known of her life back here (to my shame) until recently when she became ill.

I joined the NSW Police Force in 1974 and till 1978 I was stationed at Annandale. In 1978 I completed a Rescue course and was transferred to the Police Rescue Squad. Think this. When wearing his white overalls, he could roll up his sleeves, put the pointy end of a full size anvil in the sleeve and pick up the blunt end of the anvil and lift vertically. A powerful man with the heart of gold. Wasn't long before I met his beautiful partner Liz. She was a tiny thing, 5 foot nothing. But, when she came around for a visit, or a function at the PRS, she lit up the room. What a gentle soul she was. She would sit with anyone, everyone for a chat. She was a 'mum' to us all.

The last time I saw and spoke to Liz and Bill together was in 1985 at my wedding, and have a couple of photos. I shall treasure those photos. God bless Liz, you put up the good fight. You had so many people praying/thinking of you over these past months. The New South Wales Police Rescue Squad, The New South Wales VRA, any Rescue organisation that knew Liz will be thinking of her.
